SCHSA MEDAL FINALS RULES & SPECS.

SCHSA Perpetual Trophy Awarded to each Champion

“Keeper” Trophies from Four Oaks Farm and No Thrush Products for Champions

Dress Sheets from DaMoor’s Feed & Tack – 1st to 3rd

Leather Halters from Camelot Events to Reserve Champions

Medals & Sashes Awarded 1st to 10th

Open to members who have qualified

by competing in a qualifying Medal Class since the 2021 Finals

SCHSA 17 & Under Medal Finals

The Medal Finals in each division will consist of two phases: one round over 3’ fences, and a flat phase. The same equipment and horse must be used in both phases, except that martingales may not be used in the flat phase. The martingale may be replaced for an over fences work off. Riders must be the correct age for their division as of the date of the medal finals to be eligible to compete. Riders will draw for their order of go. It is recommended that the Flat Phase be divided into 2 or 3 sections for the convenience of viewing and scoring by the Judges. Riders that have drawn early in the Order Of Go will show in the first flat phase, followed by the group of riders who have drawn next, and so on. Judges will sit together for the flat phase giving each rider a combined score. The judges will sit together for the over fences phase, but give two separate scores with their scores being announced after each rider. The judges scores will be averaged and multiplied by 60% for the over fences and 40% for the flat. A minimum of four riders, as well as any rider within three points of the leader will be called back for a work off and will be judged by both judges sitting together. Scores from the over fences round and the flat phase will be added together and carried over to determine the work-off order, which will be Judges’ reverse order of preference. Final placings will be at the sole discretion of the Judges, and work-off scores will not be announced.

SCHSA 18 & Over Medal Finals The specifications are the same as for 17 & Under Medal Finals. Fences set at 3’.

SCHSA 12 & Under Medal Finals The specifications are the same as for 17 & Under and 18 & Over Medal Finals, except fences will be set at 2’6” and there will be no combinations on course.

SCHSA 13 & Over Medal Finals The specifications are the same as for 17 & Under and 18 & Over Medal Finals except fences will be set a 2’6”.

SCHSA Futures Medal Finals The Futures Medal Finals will consist of two rounds over fences and a work off of the top four riders plus any rider within 3 points of the leader. Open numerical scoring will be used. Scores from the first two rounds will be averaged. Order will be drawn for the first round, with riders showing in reverse order scores for the second. All riders will show in both rounds. Judges will give separate scores, but may sit together for the first two rounds, and give one score for the work off. Fences will be set at two foot three inches (2’3”). There will be no combinations on course. USEF tests 1-8. Riders will not be asked to ride without stirrups.

Quick Reference: Medal Classes

MEDAL CLASSES - GENERAL

The SCHSA offers six Medal classes. These classes must be offered in addition to fifty percent (50%) of the classes required, for SCHSA approval. Medal Classes may not be run as an open card with other classes, but 17-Under with 18-Over or 12-Under with 13-Over when it is determined that the required number of exhibitors may not be met for points to count unless classes are combined. In combined Medal Classes, the highest placing rider accruing points, in the alternate age group of the winner, will also qualify for the finals.

- Eligibility: RIDERS AND TRAINERS MUST BE CURRENT MEMBERS BEFORE ENTERING MEDAL CLASSES. It is the responsibility of riders, parents, and trainers to understand eligibility rules for each medal class and to maintain eligibility through the finals. Horses must be recorded with SCHSA.
- Qualified riders may not show in final qualifying class at show hosting the medal finals.

SCHSA FUTURES MEDAL

- This class shall consist of one round over a course of at least 8 fences not to exceed two feet three inches in height (2'3"), there shall be no combinations on course, only one change of direction is required, a work-off must be built into the course.
- This class is restricted to junior and amateur members who have not competed in a class where fences may be set over two foot six inches (2'6") in height.
- At least three exhibitors must complete the course.
- Points will be awarded as follows: 1st/10, 2nd/6, 3rd/4, 4th/2, and 5th/1.
- 10 points qualifies a rider for the finals. Riders may continue to compete after qualifying.
- Riders must maintain eligibility through the finals.
- Qualified riders may not ride in final qualifying class at the show hosting the medal finals

SCHSA 17 & UNDER HUNT SEAT MEDAL CLASS

- This class shall consist of one round over fences counted (60%) and a flat phase (40%).
- The course will consist of at least eight fences set at three feet (3') in height, with two changes of direction, and at least one combination including an oxer.
- All riders must ride in both phases.
- The same horse and equipment must be used in both phases, with the exception of martingales, which may not be used in the flat phase. Three riders must complete both phases for the class to count.
- In order to compete in a medal class riders and their trainers must be SCHSA members before entering the medal class.
- To be eligible to compete in the SCHSA 17 & Under Medal class a rider may not have won a medal class with fences exceeding three foot three inches (3'3") in height, as of the date of winning the SCHSA medal class. After qualifying, a rider may compete and/or win classes above the height and still be eligible for that year's finals. However, that rider is not eligible for SCHSA Medal classes the following year. After a period of five years has elapsed since a rider has won a medal class at three foot six inches (3'6") or higher, that rider regains his eligibility to compete in SCHSA 17&Under and/or 18 & Over Medal classes.
- In order to participate in a medal class, a rider must be eligible by age on the day the rider competes in the medal class, as well as the date on which the Medal Finals are held.
- One rider per horse.
- Qualified riders may not ride in the final qualifying class at show hosting the medal finals
- May be combined with 18 & Over Medal for points to count when less than 3 entries

Quick Reference: Medal Classes

SCHSA 18 & OVER HUNT SEAT MEDAL CLASS

- Class shall have the same specifications as the SCHSA 17 & Under Medal.
- May be combined with 17-Under Medal, for points to count when less than 3 entries.

SCHSA 13 & OVER HORSEMANSHIP MEDAL

- This class shall have the same specifications as the 17 & Under Medal EXCEPT:
 - Fences shall be set at 2'6"
 - No combinations.
 - Riders may not have shown in a class where fences are 3' or higher.
 - Riders must remain eligible through the finals.
 - May be combined with 12 & Under Medal for points to count when less than 3 entries.

SCHSA 12 & UNDER HUNT SEAT MEDAL CLASS

- This class shall have the same specification as the SCHSA 17 & Under Medal class except:
 - Fences shall be set at two foot six Inches (2'6") in height.
 - No combinations.
 - Riders may not show in any class where fences may be set at three foot three inches (3'3") or higher.
 - Riders must remain eligible through the finals.
 - May be combined with 13 & Over Medal for points to count when less than 3 entries

EQUINE INSURANCE / SCHSA CHALLENGE MEDAL CLASS

- Open to Junior and Amateur members who have not won a 3'6" Medal Finals.
- The course will consist of at least 8 fences, three foot three inches (3') in height, with at least two changes of direction, and at least one combination including an oxer.
- Jumper type fences may be used, however banks and liver-pools are not allowed.
- A minimum of two riders will work off using USEF tests 1-19.
- Three riders must complete the course for the class to count. Riders must accrue 10 points to qualify for the finals. Points are awarded: 1st/10, 2nd/6, 3rd/4, 4th/2, and 5th/1. Riders may continue to compete after qualifying for the finals. Riders with the most points (Champion & Reserve) at the end of the qualifying season will receive a special award presented by Equine Insurance at the SCHSA Banquet.. All riders with 20 or more points will also receive a year-end award.

Qualified riders may not ride in final qualifying class at the show hosting the medal finals.

There are two changes for the 2023 show season:

- 1) A horse show manager may choose to offer a minimum of three (3) SCHSA Medal Classes at their sanctioned show in lieu of offering all six (6) medal classes.
- 2) Age group medals at the same height may be combined on the prize list and split if there are sufficient entries. For example: The SCHSA 17 & Under and 18 & Over 3' Medal classes may be listed and held as the SCHSA 3' Jr/Am Medal Class. The 12 & Under and the 13 & Over 2'6" Medal Classes may be listed and held as the SCHSA 2'6" Medal Class.

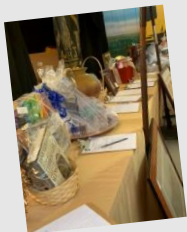

Paddock Riding Club November 27-28, 2021

The 2021 Southern California Horse Show Association Medal Finals took place at the storied Paddock Riding Club in Los Angeles, California November 27-28, 2021. This "Stand-alone" medal finals was only the second instance in the 40+ year history of the organization, but allowed riders, trainers, and horses to have a truly special and dedicated experience this Thanksgiving Weekend.

Perhaps, it was the riders saying how nice it was to show again at the Paddock Riding Club. The main ring looked beautiful. Or perhaps, it was seeing the trainers a bit more relaxed and able to catch up with one another, without the pressure of running from ring to ring. But in all likelihood, it was the camaraderie and sense of community as everyone supported each other throughout the competition.

Penny Whaler and Mike Nielson judged the five medal finals. Nielson was also the course designer. Regarding the courses, Whaler commented, "The riders had to know their horses and execute options without any bogey fences or situations."

On Saturday, following a warm-up and a last chance qualifier class, the Futures Medal Finalists were up.

Open to riders of all ages, the eight finalists were scored on two jump rounds and a work off for the top four. For some this was their first medal final.

Making Chad Mahaffey proud, by holding the lead throughout all three phases, Kendall Hefty riding Julia Greenspan's Paper Boy took the top honors. Rainbow Canyon's junior rider, Marley Urrutia was the Reserve Champion. Nicole Almansky, who rides at the Paddock with Natasha Pappas was third and Payton Jacobs, trained by Karen Perlow was fourth.

To see all those who competed, smiling as they victory galloped-long ribbons streaming and the horses showing off their neck sashes, was perfection.

SCHSA 12 & Under Medal Final 2'6"

The SCHSA 12 and Under Final came next.

Contributing 40 percent to their overall score, all riders did the flat phase first. Weighted at 60 percent of their overall score, all the riders returned for their jump round.

Wanting to see how well the riders knew their horses, Neilson's course offered inside options as well as wider tracks. Ultimately, the judges brought back Stella Tinsley, Kayla McCurdy, Sophie Sherman and Phoebe McFetridge to work off.

It was 12 year-old, Stella Tinsley, who won first place. On her championship win, Tinsley said, "I had so much fun competing at the SCHSA Medal Final! It's the best feeling when you work all year long, competing at shows only to end with a win as amazing as this." Tinsley rode Earl Grey and was trained by Nancy Frost. Dierdra Davis' rider Kayla McCurdy was Reserve Champion. Third went to Sophie Sherman and Phoebe McFetridge earned fourth.

There were 14 in the SCHSA 13 and Over 2'6" Medal and the competition was scored in the same fashion as the 12 and Under Final. Nielson and Whaler called back 4 riders to work off: Marley Urrutia, trained by Rainbow Canyon, Victoria Hwang and Lucia Koyama both trained by Karen Perlow and Emilia Denik trained by Nancy Frost.

It was Lucia Koyama who earned the Champion's Perpetual Trophy on her new mount, Custavino. Koyama showed her ability to take the shorter options and keep her composure. Koyama spoke about the course, "They really challenged you to make a plan and organize your horse through the turns." Reserve Champion was awarded to Emilia Denik. Third place went to Victoria Hwang. Marey Urrutia was honored with fourth.

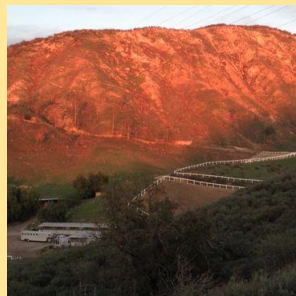
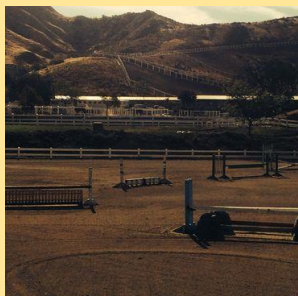
